POLKA TOUR TO POLAND - 2012

July 29/Sun - Depart USA. This evening depart for Warsaw via evening transatlantic flight with meals and movies on board.

July 30/Mon - WARSAW. After arrival at the Okęcie Airport you will be transferred to the hotel in the heart of the city. Time to unpack and relax. At 6 pm our special welcome dinner includes a folklore performance. (D)

July 31/Tue - WARSAW. This morning, we introduce you to the highlights of Poland's heroic capital beautifully rebuilt after World War II. Start at the colorful Old Town with picturesque Royal Castle square, St. John's Cathedral and remnants of the defense walls. For coffee break we invite you to the famous Warsaw café to taste a Polish doughnut, called "paczek". Included is a visit to the Uprising Museum depicting the horrific attempt to liberate Warsaw from the Nazi in 1944. Balance of the day at leisure to spend as you please. Tonight's dinner is in a fine restaurant in the old town. On the way you can admire Warsaw's illuminated monuments. (B, D)

August 1/Wed - WARSAW-Czestochowa-WISLA. After breakfast, depart for Czestochowa, pilgrimage center of Poland. Pauline Father will guide you through Jasna Gora Monastery, the Black Madonna Shrine and its treasures collected through the ages. After lunch, continue to Wisla resort in the rolling Beskid Mountains. Tonight you may walk to the Festival of Beskid Culture in progress and enjoy the excitement. You may also relax at the Aqua Park in our spacious hotel. (B, L)

August 2/Thu - WISLA. Spend a whole day discover-

ing attractions of this region: the village of Koniakow renowned for the amazing art of lace making, Kawulok's cottage where you get acquainted with daily village life of not-so-distant past. Lunch in a typical cottage with local specialties. (B, L)

August 3/Fri - WISLA-Zywiec-ZAKOPANE. After breakfast depart for the Zywiec brewery, one of the oldest in Poland. After lunch at the brewery continue to Zakopane, favorite vacation resort hidden in the majestic Tatra Mountains where wooden architecture blends with the natural landscapes. Settle-in at your hotel situated on the famous Krupowki promenade. (B, L)

August 4/Sat - ZAKOPANE. Start the day with a guided tour of the town and take a cable car to the top of the Kasprowy Wierch for spectacular vistas on the Slovak border. Balance of the day is free to shop for souvenirs of arts and crafts of the Highlanders (Gorale) at a local bazaar. In the evening, local "Gorale" will entertain you at the campfire picnic and a kielbasa roast. (B, D)

August 5/Sun - ZAKOPANE-Chochołow. Spend a relaxing day in this charming resort area. Attend Mass at the beautiful Sanctuary of Our Lady of Fatima, built as a votive for saving the life of Pope John Paul II after an assassination attempt. You have time to visit the Blazonczyk family in a picturesque Chochołow village. After lunch drive to the Pieniny National Park and relax on a fun raft ride on the Dunajec River. (B, L)

August 6/Mon - ZAKOPANE-KRAKOW. After breakfast, depart for medieval Krakow. Check-in at your hotel

conveniently located facing the Wawel Castle, a short walk to the Market Square. In the afternoon city tour starts at the Wawel Hill from where Polish kings ruled for four centuries. Tour the Coronation Cathedral where they were crowned and buried. Walk to the market square dominated by St. Mary's Basilica with Europe's largest wooden Gothic altar and the arcaded Cloth Hall dating back to the 14th century. Balance of day is at leisure. This evening you may visit Lagiewniki, center of the Divine Mercy and recently consecrated Sanctuary of Bl. Pope John Paul II with his relic. At dinner you'll be entertained by a folklore ensemble. (B, D)

August 7/Tue - KRAKOW-Zalipie-Tarnow. Whole day excursion to area's attractions. Drive through the country roads to one-of-a-kind "painted" village of Zalipie where after Easter Holiday a competition is held for the most beautiful painted cottage. Then on to the small town of Tarnow for short visit. Lunch in the 15th century Debnocastle. Return to Krakow via Lipnica Murowana, a UNESCO site, where a 12th century wooden church still stands. Overnight to Krakow. (B, L)

August 8/Wed-KRAKOW. Day free to discover more treasures of this fascinating city at your own pace. Optional excursions to Wieliczka salt mines and Auschwitz, former Nazi concentration camp will be available. In the evening gala farewell dinner. (B, D)

August 9/Thu - KRAKOW-U.S.A. This morning depart for the airport, bid "do widzenia" to your guide and board your return flight. Arrive home same afternoon. (B)

TOUR CONDITIONS

RESERVATIONS/PAYMENTS: A deposit of \$200 per person is required at the time of booking. Full payment is due on or before June 13, 2012. The price of the tour includes a built-in discount of 2% for payment by cash or check. There is no discount on credit card sales.

TOUR COST: Tour price is based on lowest airfares, tariffs and foreign currency exchange levels as of Oct. '11. It is subject to adjustment in the event of any significant changes in these tariffs or exchange levels.

TOUR ARRANGEMENTS: Air transportation will be provided via LOT Polish Airlines or other IATA carrier. Hotel accommodations are arranged in twin bedded rooms with private bath. A limited number of single rooms is available at the supplement shown. While every effort will be made to provide sharing of accommodations for persons booking alone, when requested, it cannot be guaranteed and payment of single supplement must be paid before departure when billed. Triple rooms are not available.

Unused hotel accommodations or any other unused features of this tour are not refundable or exchangeable. The right is reserved to substitute hotels and sightseeing features if it becomes necessary.

Tour members must be able to get on and off the motorcoach unaided and not require walking devices or wheelchairs.

NOT INCLUDED IN THE TOUR COST: Cost of passports, baggage handling, items of personal nature; phone calls, laundry, insurance, additional meals/beverages, gratuities to escorts and drivers.

BAGGAGE: Free baggage allowance is one piece of luggage not exceeding 50 lbs. Weight of carry-on bag may not exceed 13 lbs and fit in an overhead compartment.

NO VACCINATIONS are required by law.

DOCUMENTS: A valid U.S. or foreign passport is required. To apply for passport, contact your local Passport Agency or the nearest U.S. Post Office. Check the validity of your passport and be sure it is valid for at least three months after your return flight.

CANCELLATIONS: All cancellations must be made in writing to PAT Tours. Full refund will be made for cancellations received up to 45 days prior to departure less a \$25 administrative fee. Between 44 - 34 days deposit of \$200 is non-refundable. AIRLINE TICKETS, when issued, are subject to the airline cancellation policy applicable to the airfare used. No refund will be made for cancellations received less than 35 days prior to departure. After completion of the tour, claims for refund must be made in writing within 30 days.
